# Animals

<p>You, your friends and relatives, and any other person living in or visiting the property (including children) must not do the following.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep any animals which we feel is unsuitable (if you are not sure whether an animal is suitable please ask the Lettings Team)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Notes</b></p> <p>Unsuitable animals include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All wild animals;</li> <li>• All poisonous insects and spiders;</li> <li>• All poisonous snakes and snakes that are longer than two feet;</li> <li>• All poisonous fish, crocodiles and alligators;</li> <li>• Wild cats such as lions and tigers;</li> <li>• Wild dogs such as wolves; and</li> <li>• Monkeys and apes</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep a dog or cat in a flat with a shared entrance (unless it is a registered guide dog for a blind person or a registered hearing dog for a deaf person).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In all other council accommodation you may not keep more than two dogs or cats.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Breed any animals or birds at the property.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If you live in a house you can keep pigeons in a pigeon loft. You must get our written permission to build a pigeon loft. If we give our permission, we may set conditions that you must keep to. If you do not meet the conditions, we will take away our permissions. We may also withdraw our permission if the pigeons cause a nuisance.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep Livestock, such as horses, donkeys, goats, pigs, cattle, ducks, geese and chicken, at the property.</li> </ul>
