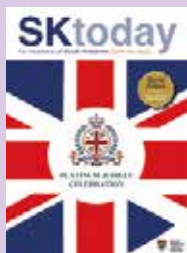

Rachael inspired to raise awareness of breast cancer

Colleagues at South Kesteven District Council have rallied to help tenancy services team member Rachael Bradley in her efforts to raise awareness of the fight against breast cancer.

Rachael, who is now in remission, co-founded Breast Friends Grantham with long-term friend Sara Green when she underwent chemotherapy in 2020.

Her latest fund-raising saw £3,500 raised at an Into The Light evening at Grantham Cricket Club to be shared between Breast Cancer Now and the Teenage Cancer Trust.

"It was an incredible night of emotion, fun, laughter and love," said Rachael.

Among the guests were the Leader of SKDC, Cllr Kelham Cooke, the Cabinet Member for People and Safer Communities, Cllr Annie Mason, Chief

Executive Karen Bradford, and many of Rachael's Council colleagues.

Rachael said: "When I was diagnosed there was no local support group available and the pandemic made it harder to access one-to-one support.

"That made me passionate about raising awareness and money for those charities that work tirelessly to help provide cancer treatment and fund research into finding a cure for this awful disease."

Karen Bradford said: "Rachael is an inspiration to us all and we are very proud to have such a caring person in our team. From a standing start this group has just grown and grown, showing the immense value of the support and help that it offers."

Rachael has received a £500 Ward Member Grant from Cllr Annie Mason in support of Breast Friends Grantham.

Fresh commitment to support Armed Forces

South Kesteven District Council has renewed its commitment to the military by again signing the Armed Forces Covenant.

The Council's leisure company, LeisureSK Ltd, has also signed the Covenant.

The Covenant, first signed by SKDC in 2012, is a shared promise by the nation that British Armed Forces personnel, veterans and families suffer no disadvantage because of service.

One updated council pledge is to encourage others to sign the Covenant, quickly taken up by LeisureSK Ltd.

The Leader of the Council, Cllr Kelham Cooke, joined Lt Col Jonathan Buxton, Commanding Officer at the Prince William of Gloucester Barracks in Grantham, for the signing ceremony.

Cllr Cooke said: "I am extremely proud to sign the Armed Forces Covenant on behalf of South Kesteven District Council. There are an estimated 8,000 military veterans living within South Kesteven and we take our responsibilities towards them extremely seriously."

Lt Colonel Buxton said: "The Army has had a close connection with Grantham since 1976.

Resigning the Covenant was a wonderful opportunity to reinvigorate that bond."

Military representatives later joined LeisureSK staff and Councillors for a signing ceremony at The Meres Leisure Centre in Grantham.

The Covenant is the first step to engaging with the Defence Employer Recognition Scheme

and helps with recruitment of skilled ex-military personnel.

Cllr Barry Dobson, LeisureSK Board Chairman and SKDC Cabinet Member for LeisureSK, signed the covenant for Leisure SK.

Cllr Dobson said: "I would urge other companies to do the same, bearing in mind the opportunity it offers to access job websites for recruitment of ex-military personnel. We know what valuable skills veterans bring from their military service."

Major Sarah Conway, Royal Logistic Corps, signed on behalf of the Ministry of Defence.

She said: "Our community links are very important to us at Prince William of Gloucester Barracks and we are delighted that LeisureSK has seen fit to sign this gesture of commitment to the military."

Charity Cup returns as organisers aim to raise community spirits

Four teams will compete for the South Kesteven Charity Cup as the pre-season football tournament returns following the Coronavirus pandemic.

The impressive trophy was purchased locally by football fan and South Kesteven District Councillor Ian Selby using his Ward Member Grant from the Council.

The first charity tournament, in 2019, was won by Harrowby United, and the event raised more than £1,000 that was shared by charities chosen by the competing clubs.

Cllr Selby said: "The intention is for it to be an annual competition in support of the clubs and their charities that will also be an important part of their pre-season schedules.

"The pandemic meant it could not go ahead in the last two years but with restrictions now lifted we are ready for kick-off again."

Harrowby United, who won the inaugural tournament, will open their defence of the trophy with a semi-final at home against Bourne Town on Tuesday 5th July at 7.45pm.

Grantham Town will play Blackstones in the other tie on Saturday 9th July at 3pm, with the final taking place the following Saturday.

The chosen charities this year are: Bourne Town – Butterfield Day Care Centre; Harrowby United – Grantham Autistic Information Network (GAIN); Grantham Town – Cancer Research; Blackstones – Second Helpings.

and sponsorship. Rowley's Commercial Energy Assessments, of Grantham, are already on board as the main sponsor, with Grantham-based Marren Tiles and Geiger Media also supporting the event.

Cllr Selby has set up a small committee to help run the tournament – Graham Cowell, Dave Philpotts, Mick Massingham, Nickie Cowell.

The committee is seeking the support of other businesses or individuals that may wish to

support the tournament with match day, match ball or man-of-the-match sponsorship, or any other aspect of the event.

Graham said: "The first tournament was a great success. We wanted to build on that but could not do so because of the pandemic.

"Now it's back we hope it will help lift community spirits. Not only will it raise money for local charities it will also help these locals clubs with their preparations for the new season.

"I hope lots of fans come down to watch some great football, support their teams and help raise a lot of money for good causes."

The tournament is registered with the Lincolnshire Football Association, which will provide match officials.

Council grants help manage disability

Disabled residents across the District are benefitting from life-altering adaptations to their homes after successfully applying for Disabled Facilities Grants.

South Kesteven District Council grants fund a range of adaptations for private homeowners and tenants, housing association and council tenants alike.

For 76 year-old-Alan Clark, the stairlift installed in his Grantham home last autumn has been life-changing.

"I cannot get upstairs without it," he said. "I was forced to go upstairs on my hands and knees before the stairlift was fitted so I am really grateful to the Council for installing it. It's an absolute godsend and I would be completely jiggered without it."

Wheelchair user Paul Zeimer is also finding life transformed by a recently installed step-lift ramp at his home, which means his wife Wendy no longer has to help manoeuvre his chair in and out of their home.

Paul said: "It's completely transformed my life, and helped maintain my independence by being able to get out on my own. As someone who is reliant on a wheelchair, it's wonderful."

Cllr Robert Reid, Cabinet Member for Housing, said: "I have seen for myself what a huge difference these adaptations can make to a person's life, and we are committed to help our residents continue to live in their own homes for as long as possible.

"It's important that we support our more vulnerable residents - we are doing all we can to help manage the challenges of a disability."

to raise cheer across the district

It's celebration time as South Kesteven joins the nation in marking of a unique milestone – the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in honour of Her Majesty's remarkable 70-year reign.

Villages and towns across the district are planning events right through the Jubilee weekend, ensuring that the district will be flying the flag for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

There are nine major beacon lighting events in South Kesteven, all taking place at 9.45pm on Thursday 2nd June, as part of a nationally co-ordinated programme outlined by Buckingham Palace.

Events over the Jubilee weekend are being organised by parish councils, village halls and community groups and will include barn dances,

street parties, music, family entertainment – and even a rounders match and an Epsom Ladies Day!

Cllr Annie Mason, SKDC Cabinet Member for People and Safer Communities, said "It's incredible to see what's being planned. It's such an important event and it's being celebrated with an outpouring of affection and respect for the Queen.

"We have been made only too aware of the value of communities in the last two years and this is the most fabulous way to again bring people together."

Tree planting adds to Queen's canopy

Two council-owned parks have contributed to the Queen's Green Canopy tree planting initiative marking Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee.

Grantham and Stamford MP Gareth Davies attended the planting of five native rowan trees by South Kesteven District Council in Dysart Park, Grantham, to celebrate the milestone anniversary.

The trees were funded by SKDC's climate change reserve fund and were part of environmental improvements delivered by its Blue Green Corridor partnership environmental project along the River Witham.

The work has been helped by individuals working under supervision from Community Payback, where sentences require community service.

Grantham DIY WI group then added its own tribute with a silver birch tree, commemorating Her Majesty's reign and the 13th anniversary of the group's formation.

Cllr Rosemary Trollope-Bellew, SKDC Cabinet Member for Culture and Visitor Economy, said: "Every tree matters as we tackle climate change and we look forward to seeing these

"It's so encouraging to see a partnership between the Council, our specialist contractors Lions Environmental, and Community Payback, which has previously helped with work in Grantham Cemetery, Wyndham Park and Queen Elizabeth Park."

Paul Sturton, Community Payback Operations Manager for East and West Lincolnshire, said: "Our partnership with SKDC is going from strength to strength.

The projects are enabling people on probation to undertake meaningful work to make reparation to the communities in which they have offended."

WI members funded the silver birch and a commemorative plaque. Branch president Anne Kilroy said: "We are looking forward to watching our tree grow and are pleased that it will be locking up carbon, supporting wildlife, and giving pleasure to local people."

In Queen Elizabeth Park, a rare wild service tree was donated by the Lincolnshire Gardens Trust, with members joined at the planting ceremony by council representatives.

The Blue Green Corridor project, funded largely by the European Regional Development Fund, runs through Dysart Park, Wyndham Park and Queen Elizabeth Park.

Who are our community champions for 2022? That's what South Kesteven District Council wants to find out as it launches this year's SK Community Awards.

The 2021 winners summed up the very best of the District, and all received engraved crystal trophies as a memento of the esteem in which they are held by their communities.

And what a range of winners we had. Awards went to a five-year-old boy waging war on litter; an air cadet training stalwart; a young LIVES first responder; plus an undertaker with a difference – and a generous heart.

There were trophies for a food distribution heroine, a cultural ground-breaker, and the founder of a fitness and wellbeing network, while a community counselling charity picked up two awards.

Now the hunt is on again for those people

who put themselves out to help others, and this year there will be a public awards ceremony where winners will accept their awards. We have also included a category for schools participating in green projects.

Cllr Annie Mason, SKDC Cabinet Member for People and Safer Communities, said: "Last year our awards recognised some truly amazing people, and I could not believe just how varied our winners were. It was amazing.

"Now we want to do it all again. Look around, see who is making a difference in your community and nominate them. Let's give them the recognition they deserve."

Nominations are open from June 1st with a closing date of July 18th.

A person or organisation can be nominated for more than one award. All winners will be announced in September and all nominees will be recognised with a certificate commending their efforts.

Our awards cover a wide range of activities and community efforts, encouraging nominations across the board.

Inspirational Young Person

We're looking to celebrate a young person who is either pioneering or supporting an activity or project that is making a difference in their local community. Nominations are encouraged in support of young people aged up to 25 years.

Business and the Community

Do you know a business involved in, and benefitting, its local community? Perhaps it is working to make the local area smarter, safer, healthier or more sustainable. It could be contributing with projects to reduce carbon emissions and improving climate change outcomes.

Best School Green Project

This award celebrates green projects demonstrating success in the protection or conservation of the environment. We are looking for projects in the community or focusing on improving the environmental impact within the school setting, including all primary, junior and secondary schools.

Good Neighbour

This award is for someone who has gone above and beyond to help their neighbour or their community - someone your neighbourhood couldn't manage without. This may be through good deeds done on a regular basis or stepping in when there's an emergency.

Lifetime Community Champion

We want to celebrate individuals who have contributed time and effort to a club, group, charity or organisation. Is there someone in your community who has given their life selflessly in the service of others, possibly a public servant, a local charity worker/supporter or fund raiser?

Health and Wellbeing

Do you know an individual or group contributing to the wellbeing of others? Is there someone in your community who has helped others to make positive healthy lifestyle changes? Our judges are looking for people whose actions have a positive impact on mental wellbeing, sports and physical activity.

The Neil Smith Beyond the Call of Duty Award

This special award, given in memory of our late colleague Neil Smith, acknowledges the amazing work of our blue-light services. Nominations can be for a community police officer, a paramedic or ambulance crew, a local fire officer or crew, a volunteer first responder or a doctor.

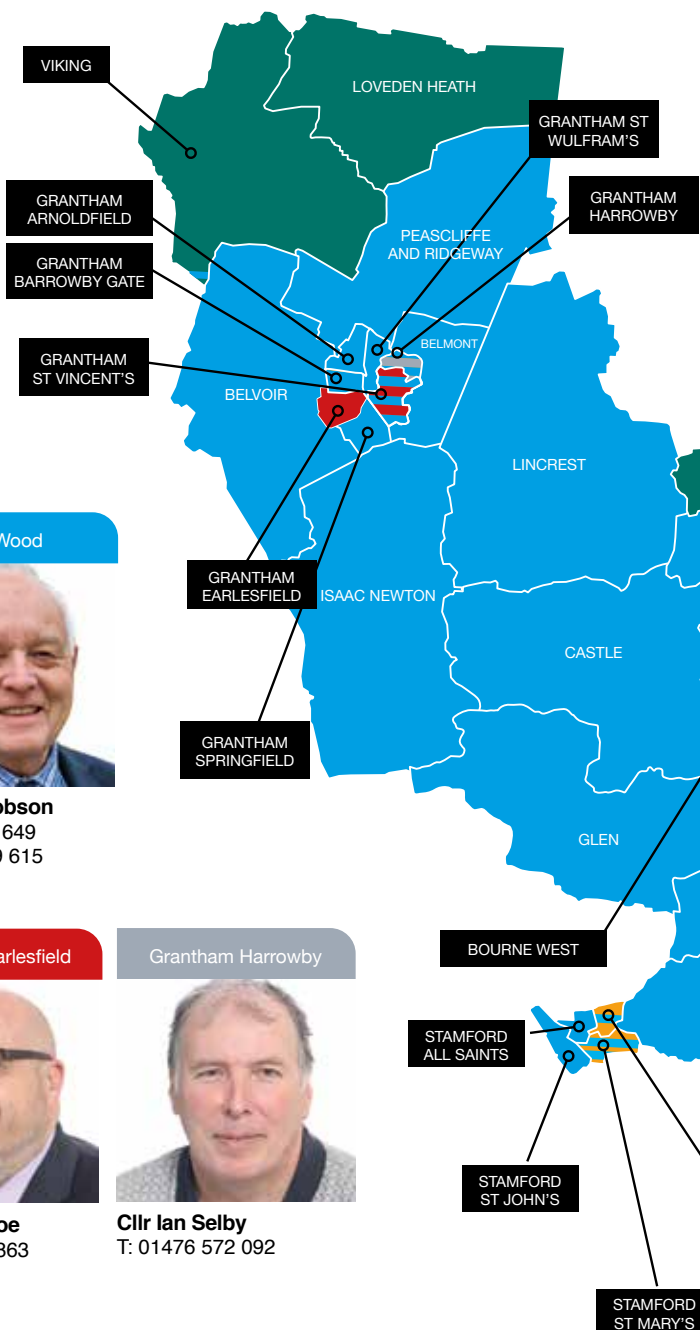

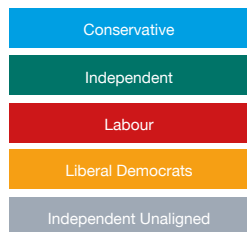

Should Grantham have its own town council?

Around 1,500 people have responded to a consultation gathering public opinion on whether Grantham should have a town council.

South Kesteven District Council wanted to test the level of public support for a parish or town council for the town.

The resulting Community Governance Review consultation, which closed on April 22nd, asked for comments on:

- the possibility of creating a new parish or town council for Grantham
- where the administrative boundary for that area might be
- the number of councillors and the number of wards to any new council
- the impact of any proposed boundary changes on neighbouring parish councils

Cllr Graham Jeal, Chairman of the SKDC Community

Governance Working Group – a committee of all councillors who represent the unparished area of Grantham, said: “We would like to thank everyone who took part in the consultation. Just over 23,000 households were contacted, and I am pleased that so many people chose to respond and have their say.

“The results of this review will determine where decisions affecting the people of Grantham are taken, and by whom.”

The working group is now considering results of the consultation before making a recommendation to full council.



Changing Places grant to provide new facilities

South Kesteven District Council has received £160,000 to create new Changing Places facilities at four locations across the district for people who cannot use standard toilet facilities.

The money has come from Government's Changing Places Fund, through which the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities is making £23.5 million available to local authorities in England.

Changing Places provide larger, more accessible facilities, equipped with hoists, curtains,

adult-sized changing benches, and can support users, their families, and carers.

The Leader of SKDC, Cllr Kelham Cooke, said: “I am delighted that we have been awarded such significant funding. Accessible facilities like these make a huge difference to the lives of disabled people, their families and carers.”

Muscular Dystrophy UK is working in partnership with the Government to deliver the Changing Places facilities, and will be providing SKDC with technical advice and training.

Welcome to evacuees

South Kesteven District Council is working to ensure evacuees arriving in the area from Ukraine receive support and a warm welcome.

The Council has been notified of more than 60 sponsor households in South Kesteven who have matched with Ukrainian evacuees and together applied for visas under the national Homes For Ukraine scheme.

The Leader of SKDC, Cllr Kelham Cooke, said: “The humanitarian crisis resulting from the Russian invasion of Ukraine has affected millions of people and touched the hearts of every one of us.

“Our thanks go to residents who have shown their support by offering accommodation to those escaping the war, and we will do everything we can to ensure evacuees receive a warm welcome and are given all the help they need to settle into their new homes.”

Officers from SKDC are visiting accommodation that has been offered to check it is suitable and are collecting information to verify the identification of sponsors and their household members (aged 16+) so that Lincolnshire County Council can facilitate Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks.
